SUMMONS.

In the Circuit Court of the State of Oregon for Harney County.

State Land Board, composed of James Withycombe, Governor, Ben W. Olcott, Secretary and Thos. B. Kay, Treasurer of the State of Ore-

Esper Greathouse, A. O. Skotterud, Charles H. Mulkey and Georgia Mulkey, his wife, defendants.

To Esper Greathouse, one of the above named defendants:

In the name of the State of Oregon, you are hereby required to appear and answer the complaint filed against you in the above entitled court and cause within six weeks from the date of the first publication of this summons, and if you fail so to appear and answer for want thereof the plaintiff will apply to the court for the relief demanded in its complaint on file in this suit, as follows, to-wit:

Judgment against you for the sum of \$1671.22 with interest from January 17, 1918, at the rate of six per cent per annum until paid, and the sum of \$200.00 attorney fee and the costs and disbursements of this suit; that a certain mortgage described in said complaint and given by you to plaintiff covering and upon the S 1/2 of NW 1/4, the SW 1/4 of NE 1/4 and NE 1/4 of SW 1/4 section 23, T. 21, S. R. 30, E. W. M. Harney County Oregon be declared to be a first lien upon said premises to secure the payment of all sums above mentioned, and that said mortgage be foreclosed and said lands sold in the manner provided by law for the sale of real property on execution; that the proceeds of said sale be applied to the payment of said sums and all thereof; that if any deficiency remains after the application of such proceeds

plaintiff have judgment and execution against you for the amount thereof; and that you as well as each and all of the above defendants, and all persons claiming by, through or under you, or any of you, from and after August 30th, 1919, the date of said mortgage, be forever barred and foreclosed of any and all right title, interest, claim, lien or demand in, to or upon said lands and each and every part thereof, except the statutory right of redemption; that plaintiff may have such other and further relief in the premises as shall seem equitable and just.
