Making Alfalfa Hay Requires **Exact Methods**

(Special Information Service, U. S. Department of Agriculture.)

Valuable as alfalfa is, it has its drawbacks. It is difficult to establish in some parts of the country, especially in the eastern States. It requires careful methods of handling. It is no crop for the careless farmer; but is a very profitable one for the farmer who will take the trouble to learn how to handle it from the seeding to the feeding. One of the important things to learn is just how to make alfalfa hay, according to specialists of the United States Department of Agriculture.

Alfalfa does not cure at all readily, and good quality hay is hard to get. Especially is this true of the first cutting, which comes when heavy rains curing. The bright green hay so emmon in the irrigated sections is almost never seen in the humid regons, due to injury from rain.

Most farmers are prone to cut their alfalfa too early. They are anxious get more cuttings, thereby thinking to get a bigger crop. The first growth usually is rank, metimes causing the farmer to hink it should be cut before it realy is ready. The stage of growth is he indication for cutting rather than rale is to cut alfalfa just as it is coming into bloom and the basal shoots ere making a good start for the next rop. In eastern states, cutting earier may injure and frequently kills the plants. Cutting later lowers the feeding value of the hay.

Methods of making alfalfa hay vary ry; but the basic principles are the ne. The motto everywhere is: Cure alfalfa hay quickly, with as little handling and exposure to the weather as possible." Rapid curing holds the leaves on better. Less handling knocks fewer of them off. This is important because the leaves re the most nutritious part of the

In the west where there is little all during the haying season, the nowers are started in the morning ad the hay raked into windrows the ollowing day. The hay is then cockd or is stacked or baled direct from he windrow as soon as the hay is sufficiently cured. The raking coms as soon as the leaves are wiltd, but when the stems are still en. It is cocked when the stems re "half dry." It may be stacked then moisture can no longer be wisted out of a wisp of the hay.
