FIRE DANGER EMPHASIZED IN TRUPLING INCIDENT

Cigarette End Might Have Caused Serious Loss Under Different Circumstances.

The press of the Northwest generally is calling attention to the extreme danger of fires owing to the unusual dryness of the season. An example of what lack of care might mean was demonstrated in this city Wednesday when men working around the A. A. Perry Feed Barn detected the odor of burning straw. On investigation, a patch of smoldering fire "no larger than a man's hand" was found on the edge of a drying refuse pile outside the barn. Fortunately no wind was blowing, and a bucket of water was sufficient to extinguish the makings of a fire blaze. It was thought a cigarette end thrown from a passing auto was the cause. Had this occurred at night, with a light breeze blowing, there is no doubt that Burns would have another conflagration recorded.
