A steam press for all kinds of fine and delicate work for ladies will take care of furs, plush, velvets, chinchillas, velvet hats, etc. An electric furnace for drying purposes is also included in the equipment. Mr. Hirsch has established an agency here for his place, and will take particular inter-

est in all mail orders, which will be returned within 24 hours from the time they reach his place of business.
