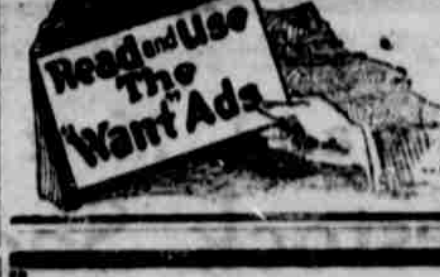

cool. When the meat is smoked it can hang in the smokehouse, but for absolute safe keeping it should be wrapped or packed away.
Dry-cured meat is better after six months, and when kept under favorable conditions may be good for two or three years, as the sirup or sugar holds the moisture.
Brine or sweet pickle cured pork is too dry to be enjoyed after three or four months of age, and becomes very hard if held for a year. If the small pieces were cured with the sweet pickle cure to be used up first, the heavier or larger pieces should be cured with the dry cure and it would be ready for use about the time the supply of sweet pickle-cured meat would be exhausted. This would insure meat of best quality at all seasons of the year.
