and could be done without asking for a big issue. The employment of a necessary engineering force to make a map of the project and an estimate of the cost of construction is the next step. These maps and estimates are submitted to the State Engineer for his approval. The landowners must have a complete check upon the affairs of the district and are safeguarded. The State Engineer is required by law to look up on the work of the project engineers and determine the feasibility of the project. It is up to the state officials to see that the estimates are what they should be and that work has been properly done. Another fact important to the land owners is that the State Engineer is also required to check the estimate of the cost of construction and advise them as to whether or not, in his opinion, the project can be constructed on the estimate, said Captain Duncan. Another way for the land owners to know whether

they are being served by competent talent or not.

The board of directors and commissioners submit the plans and proposal for bond issue to members of the district after due published notice, again putting it up to the people for their approval or rejection. The directors are nominated by the land owners either by petition or at a mass meeting, which must be at least fifteen days previous to the election. It is proposed in this instance to nominate the commissioners at the same time.
