

PETITION FOR IRRIGATION DISTRICT AND CHANGE OF TIME AND PLACE OF CONVEYANCE THEREOF. TO THE COUNTY COURT OF THE STATE OF OREGON, FOR THE COUNTY OF HARNEY: We, the undersigned petitioners, desiring to form an irrigation district embracing the lands hereinafter designated, and within the boundaries hereinafter described, in order that said district may use the waters of Slivies River, Foley Slough and their tributaries, and construct works for the irrigation of said lands, and provide for the reconstruction, betterment, extension, purchase, operation and maintenance of works already constructed solely or in part to irrigate the whole or any portion of said lands do, as a basis for our petition, respectfully represent to this court and the Judge thereof, as follows:

(1) Each of the undersigned fifty (50) individuals is a citizen of the United States of America, more than twenty-one years of age, and a bona fide owner of one acre or more of land irrigated or susceptible of irrigation situated in said proposed district and included within the lands herein designated. The name of such subscriber appears upon the last assessment roll for Harney County, Oregon.

(2) It is the purpose of said petitioners to organize an irrigation district under the provisions of Chapter 357 of the general laws of Oregon for the year 1917, as amended.

(3) The boundaries of said district are as follows: Beginning at the Northwest corner Sec. 23, Twp. 23 S. R. 32 E. W. M.; thence east to quarter corner on north line said Sec. 23; thence south to center Sec. 23; thence east to center Sec. 24; thence south to quarter corner on south line Sec. 24; thence east to northeast corner Sec. 24; thence south on range line to northeast corner Sec. 35; thence east to quarter corner on north line said Sec. 35; thence south to center Sec. 35; thence east to center Sec. 36; thence south to quarter corner on north line Sec. 36; thence east to quarter corner on east line Sec. 36, being range line; thence north on range line to southeast corner Sec. 36, Twp. 24 S. R. 31 E. W. M.; thence west to southwest corner Sec. 36; thence north to quarter corner on west line Sec. 36; thence west to center Sec. 35; thence north to quarter corner on north line Sec. 35; thence west to southwest corner Sec. 27; thence north to northwest corner Sec. 27; thence west to quarter corner on south line Sec. 19; thence north to center Sec. 19; thence west to quarter corner on west line Sec. 19 being range line; thence north to northwest corner Sec. 19; thence west to southwest corner Sec. 13; Twp. 24 S. R. 30 E. W. M.; thence north to northwest corner Section 36 Twp. 23 S. R. 30 E. W. M.; thence east to northeast corner Sec. 36, being range line; thence north on range line to northwest corner Sec. 18 Twp. 23 S. R. 31 E. W. M.; thence east to quarter corner on north line said Sec. 18; thence north to northwest corner SW 1/4 SE 1/4 Sec. 7; thence east to the west bank of Slivies River; thence in a general northwesterly direction along the west bank of such Slivies River and following the meander line thereof to where same is intersected by section line between sections 6 and 7; thence west to the southwest corner Sec. 1, Twp. 23 S. R. 30 E. W. M.; thence north to northwest corner sec. 36 Twp. 23 S. R. 30 E. W. M.; thence west to quarter corner on south line Sec. 25; thence north to center Sec. 25; thence east to quarter corner on west line Sec. 25; thence north to the northwest corner Sec. 23, being the place of beginning.

(4) The land irri-ceptible of irrigation, embraced within the above described boundary as situated within Harney County, Stat. of Oregon, and is more particularly described as follows: Township 22 South, Range 33 E.W.M. WHEREFORE, your petitioners pray that a hearing be had and that on the final hearing an order be made and entered (1) determining whether the requisite number of owners of lands within said proposed district have petitioned for the formation thereof, (2) whether the petition and the notice of time of presentation thereof have been duly published as by said law provided, (3) designating the name of said district, (4) establishing and defining the boundaries thereof, (5) calling an election for the purposes herein set forth, (6) fixing the time and place therefor and (7) establishing a convenient number of election precincts in said proposed district and defining the boundaries of said precincts; and your petitioners further pray that all things necessary for the formation of said district and for the holding of said election as by law required be done, and that said district be organized under such act as amended, and so your petitioners will ever pray.
