PETITION FOR AN IRRIGATION DISTRICT TO BE PRESENTED TO THE COUNTY COURT OF HARNEY COUNTY, STATE OF OREGON, UNITED STATES OF AMERICA, ON THE 7TH DAY OF JANUARY, 1920.

That it is the purpose of the undersigned petitioners to organize an irrigation district under and by virtue of the irrigation district laws of the State of Oregon as recited in Chapter 257, General Laws of Oregon, 1917, providing for the organization and management of irrigation districts; and

That Your Honorable Court do proclaim a district as set forth herein; designating the name of said district; dividing said district into three subdivisions and defining the boundaries thereof; and

That Your Honorable Court proceed, with such dispatch as may be under said law to call an election for the purposes above set forth and do all things necessary under said law for the formation of said district, designating the time and places for voting at said election; and

That the boundaries and description of land under said district shall be as follows, to-wit: Beginning at the northwest corner of Section 4, Township 23 South, Range 31 East, Willamette Meridian, in Harney County, Oregon; thence east along north line of Secs. 4 and 3 to N. E. corner of Sec. 3; thence southeast to S. E. corner of the NE 1/4 NW 1/4 of Sec. 2; thence northeast to the N. W. corner of Sec. 1; thence along the north line of Sec. 1 to the N. E. corner of Sec. 1, all in the same town and range; thence east along north line of Secs. 6 and 5 in Township 23 South, Range 32 East, W. M., to the N. E. corner of said Sec. 5; thence south to the east quarter corner of said Sec. 5; thence southeast to the S. E. corner of Sec. 4; thence east on the line between Secs. 3 and 10 to the S. E. corner of Sec. 3; thence south to the east quarter corner of said Sec. 10; thence east along the center line through Secs. 11 and 12, to the east quarter corner of Sec. 12, all in the same township and range, and being to a point on the range line between ranges 32 and 32 1/2 East, W. COUNTS OUR BUSHELS AND POUNDS FOR US



It may be the task of most of us to produce the bushels and pounds which is the world's supply annually, but it is this man's job to count them and he does it all through a maze of figures which few laymen could understand. He is Leon M. Estbrook, chief of the Bureau of Crop Estimates in the Department of Agriculture at Washington—and himself a farmer—over in Maryland.
