

NOTICE OF ELECTION FOR ORGANIZATION OF AN IRRIGATION DISTRICT UNDER THE NAME OF HARNEY VALLEY IRRIGATION DISTRICT AND FOR ELECTION OF DIRECTORS THEREFOR.

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN. That on Tuesday the 10th day of February, 1920 an election will be held in Harney County, Oregon at the polling places and within the voting precincts hereinafter described, for the purpose of determining whether or not an irrigation district to be known as HARNEY VALLEY IRRIGATION DISTRICT shall be organized under the provisions of Chapter 357, Laws 1917, of the State of Oregon, and acts amendatory thereof.

M. has been designated by the Court as Precinct Number One of said proposed irrigation district and the polling place thereof fixed at the office of the William Hanley Company in Sec. 21 Twp. 23 S. R. 31 E. W. M.; All that part of said district south of said line running from the northwest corner of Sec. 27 Twp. 24 S. R. 31 E. W. M. to the northwest corner of Sec. 27

WEEDLESS ALFALFA GROWN.

Weed-free alfalfa seed has been grown by a Nyssa Oregon, farmer. For several years he had his seed tested at the federal and agricultural college seed testing laboratory and found it very satisfactory. Following the suggestions of the farm crops department he got seed from various sources until he found one lot quite pure. This he seeded a well cleaned field, a sample of the crop analyzing 100 per cent pure in a college test 98 per cent weed-free. The entire 1919 crop was practically weed free—entirely free from the parasitic dodder. He says that testing pays last week. A second sample analyzed big, and recommends it for all alfalfa plantings.
