The trial of the 10 Wobblies at Montesano for the murder of four buddies at Centralia last Armistice day is drawing to a close. The so called "defense" has flattened out. It is claimed that over 600 rifles and large quantities of ammunition have been sold by dealers in firearms in the vicinity of Montesano since the trial began seven weeks ago and that the purchasers are men that have been identified largely with the radical elements. As a result the Governor of Washington requested Federal authorities to send troops to Montesano to preserve order and one hundred doughboys from Camp Lewis are on the job and you will find the six hundred rifles are no longer a threat. Another week should conclude the trial. Every patriotic man and woman hopes that the sentences of the Court and Jury may be speedily carried out, whatever it may be. Efforts to inject into this trial labor disputes and socialistic half truths and untruths have not been availing, the trial so far has been an excellent example of American jury trials. The pettyfogging of endeavor, counsel for the defendants, and the large sum spent by the defense for "investigations" has not been able to prevent the state from conducting the trial as it should be conducted, although it has resulted in two witnesses for the defense being indicted for perjury, and there is a probability that more indictments will follow.
