 It will be of interent to all sheepien in Heruey County to know that the yarious wool growers annoclations
working with the Bureau, have arranged with the Fed-
eral Reserve Board, a plan whereby the wool grower may be ananced on this seanon's wool ellp until such time
as a normal buyers market preva tis.
Under no circumstances should the grower sell on the present market
and since be can least 25 per cent per pound on hit
wool if it in ahtpped to some wool warehoune, there should be but few hold for a higher price.
Tute money can be borrowed trom
