These are rather unhandy to mail out and for that reason will be held in The Times-Herald office to be given out as called for. The letter reads:

Portland, November 5, 1920.

My Dear Mr. Byrd:  
Under separate cover I am returning to you the records of the thirty children examined at the County Fair Children's Booth. As you know Miss Schreyer was requested to bring these records for final marking. It has been difficult to choose the one apparently in best condition for many of them might have been classed as children of high grade condition.

However, since it seemed desirable to give some special mention, we are glad to call your attention to the names Carroll Bennett and Alice Crandall. Both of these children measure exceedingly well and if the parents will present these same slips when the next children's clinic is held they will prove of even more benefit than they are at present, for it not only what the child is now, but the degree of development which results during the next year or two which counts most for his well being.

While the two babies named may appear to be in better condition now than some of the others, a year hence some other child will show a more favorable year's development, perhaps, than is now indicated in their record. I should think that the package of records represents a

mighty fine bunch of babies.

I hope the parents may find some helpful suggestions in the dodger which accompanies each record. I would especially call your attention to the fact that the figures in the upper left hand corner of the records have no connection with the child's report.
