**BEST FATTENING LAMBS**  
**BLOCKY, 60-POUND TYPE**  
Black-face Blood Also Said to be Desirable—Late Born Animals Make Good Feeders  
Ideal feeder lambs to fatten for the meat trade are thrifty, smooth, blocky, black-faced animals weighing about 60 pounds when put on feed, says the agricultural college experiment station report, "Fattening Lambs," just published as station bulletin 175.  
Lambs weighing less than 50 pounds are usually held over and marketed as yearlings. Those weighing 80 or more should be ready for market without further feeding.  
The good feeder lambs have not been studied. An early lamb that has had good feed all summer and is still only a feeder in the fall most likely has something wrong with him.  
Late lambs and those from scanty feed district usually make good feeders.  
Methods of feeding, both under sheds and in open lots, have a great deal to do with the success and profits of the feeding. These things are fully explained in the bulletin, which can be had on application to the college at Corvallis.
