Black-face Blood Also Said to be De sirable-fate Born Animals Make Good Feeders

Ideal feeder Jambs to fatten for the meat trade are thrifty, smooth, blocky, black-faced animals weighing about 60 pounds when put on feed, says the agricultural college experiment station report, "Fattening Lambs," just published as station bulletin 175.

Lambs weighing less than 50 pounds are usually held over and marketed as yearlings. Those weighing 80 or more should be ready for market without further feeding.
