FARM REMINDERS

Dairyman should not cut down on their dry feed because of the apparent abundance of green feed. If they do, the milk flow will be lessened, and if they continue doing it for any length of time the cows will not give their full portion of milk until the next lactation period. The condition of the cows will be seriously affected as well.

By using their hay as feed for dairy heifers, for sheep and to less extent for idle horses, many successful farmers not only reduce the amount of hay fed but get plant feed back into the soil in an economical and effective way. Notwithstanding this feed and fertilizer use of straw some farmers continue to burn their straw stacks annually.

The amount of rainfall retained as usable water by Oregon soils varies from two-thirds inch per acre foot on the coarse sandy soils of Umatilla county to 2 inches on the heaviest clay types of western Oregon. Fine sand retains 1 inch, sandy loam 1 1/2 inches. Measurements are now made with a moisture equivalent centrifuge recently installed by the department.

The State Farm Bureau federation is practically assured, seven county bureaus out of the 12 required having already voted in favor of federation. Jackson county led, followed in quick succession by Benton and Polk. Morrow and Sherman counties are committed to the idea, and Umatilla county gives assurance that it will be endorsed there. In southern Oregon, Josephine county has joined Jackson in support of the federation.
