FOREST PROTECTION WEEK

Forest Protection Week is each year set aside by Presidential Proclamation as a time to bring to the attention of the American people the vast unnecessary wastage of our forests by fire, and to devise means whereby the appalling losses shall be at least curtailed, if not eliminated. The Governors of many states will issue proclamations supplementing the one issued by President Coolidge.

Forest Protection Week originated on the Pacific Coast several years ago. It soon grew to national proportions, and in 1921 President Harding issued a Proclamation which placed the Federal Government in general, and the Forest Service in particular, squarely behind the movement. President Harding signed Proclamations again in 1922 and 1923. This year President Coolidge will issue a Proclamation carrying upon all citizens, either in association or as individuals, to make proper observance of the Week. All Governors will be urged to issue supplemental proclamations, especially in reference to the celebration of Arbor Day during Forest Protection Week.

FARM POINTERS

Dry lime-sulfur dissolved in water is a convenient substitute for commercial liquid lime sulfur the Oregon station reports. It is somewhat more expensive to apply than lime-sulfur solution of equivalent strength. However, it is commending itself to those who cannot readily obtain the liquid lime-sulfur or who have to haul it a long distance. The excellent quality of some of the dry lime-sulfur on the market is leading to an increased use of this material among commercial growers.
