INDICTMENT
IN THE CIRCUIT COURT OF THE STATE OF OREGON FOR THE COUNTY OF HARNEY.

The State of Oregon,

vs.

I. Weinstein

I. Weinstein is accused by the Grand Jury of the County of Harney by this Indictment of the crime of **SELLING LOTTERY TICKETS.**

Committed as follows:

The said I. Weinstein is accused by the Grand Jury of Harney County on the 1st day of September A. D. 1923, in the said County of Harney and State of Oregon then and there being did and offer for sale, and keep on hand for the purpose of sale and did advertise and cause to be advertised for sale and did there sell lottery tickets on one Ford Automobile.

Contrary to the Status in such cases made and provided and against the peace and dignity of the State of Oregon.

Dated at Burns, Oregon in the County of Harney, this 4th day of April A. D. 1924.

Witnesses subpoenaed and examined before the Grand Jury and for the State of Oregon: W. A. Goodman, A. C. Welcome.

Note that A. C. Welcome's name appears on the indictment as a witness. He was subpoenaed by the State to bring the Box in which the tickets that we have given away are deposited. This box is kept in the First National Bank. He was not a complaining witness or in any way interested in the case, nor did he appear on his own accord.

Upon being notified of the indictment, Mr. I. Weinstein appeared before the court and plead Not Guilty, filed a Bond and asked to have the case set for trial at once. (Within an hour after the news spread of the indictment 62 Burns People called us, offered their regrets at such an uncalled for action and offered to sign petitions or any thing that we might suggest in order that the people might show their disapproval of this outrageous action.) (Remember that these were only people from the city of Burns, and that since that date people from the outlying and adjoining districts have been calling every day.)

The case was set for trial but each day the Prosecuting attorney, Geo. Sizemore would continually delay proceedings asking for more time etc., (other legal methods) and finally they were successful in laying the trial over until the Next Court Holds Session in Burns.

NOW GOOD PEOPLE, please refer back the indictment, the body or main point is charged, "FOR SELLING LOTTERY TICKETS ON ONE FORD AUTOMOBILE." We never did sell any tickets whatsoever on the Ford Car. We gave you Absolutely FREE OF CHARGE A TICKET ON THE FORD CAR WITH EVERY TEN DOLLARS WORTH OF MERCHANDISE THAT YOU PURCHASED FROM US. YOU ALL KNOW THE CHEAP PRICES THAT WEINSTEIN SELLS FOR. GOOD PEOPLE YOU KNOW THAT WHEN YOU BUY TEN DOLLARS WORTH OF MERCHANDISE FROM WEINSTEIN, YOU GET FULL VALUE FOR YOUR MONEY, AND ON TOP OF THIS WE GAVE YOU ABSOLUTELY FREE OF CHARGE A TICKET ON THE FORD AUTOMOBILE. AND FOR THIS WE ARE INDICTED. What then should be done with the operators of Gambling Devices. What then should be done with the District Attorney who is a constant customer of these gambling devices?
