#### WE SHOULD HAVE THAT ROAD

The mass meeting at the court house last Friday evening to discuss the plan of cooperating with the Forest Service in building a road between here and the Grant county line to connect with the hard surface road now being constructed to Bear valley was not as largely attended as it was hoped and there was a disposition among some to go slow. Harney county has no bonded indebtedness and this is considered a big asset. This may be true, but on the other hand it is a drawback to allow this to stand in the way of an improvement that is needed, especially with the present favorable situation to it. Through with so much aid from the Forest development fund. With the plan so well under way and the fact that the Forest service is in favor of the road with the inclination to be liberal in providing funds should not be lost sight of. If we had \$500, or if we could be assured of a gift of \$1,500, if we could raise the \$500, don't it look like good business to raise the \$500?

When this can be arranged without adding one cent to our present taxes and in addition bring a permanent maintenance fund of \$200 a mile, which is a good investment. The receipts from the Forest is going to increase appreciably within next three years. It can be pledged to refund any bond issue. It need not all be used for such purpose but a certain amount each year set aside as a sinking fund and the balance used on other road work.

While we are about it why not make a bond issue to complete some of the roads already started in the county that should connect up with

somewhere instead of leaving them in their present unfinished condition and give actual benefit for the money now expended? We have such roads and with additional work we have them connect up with roads that will bring much benefit to communities and at the same time give us access to state and transcontinental highways.

Why should Harney county lag behind in these improvements when they are so essential, especially when everything is favorable to securing outside aid? The Forest development funds are already appropriated and we have to pay our portion. If we don't use the funds they will go elsewhere as they have in the past. We're not reducing our taxes any by not taking advantage of securing cooperation funds—they are being used by other counties and districts—and we help to foot the bills just the same.

Harney county is going to develop rapidly at once. Why not meet this development now and be ready to reap the benefit rather than wait until the opportunity of securing aid under favorable conditions that will not be possible later. We can have some improvements going on within a short time and bring the aid of considerable outside resources to our own county instead of allowing it to be used in other sections and the opportunity lost to us forever.

#### AN OPEN LETTER

It is a source of regret and much disappointment that I am unable to visit the several sections of Harney County and personally meet with my friends and supporters; a severe illness kept me away from my official duties some two weeks and I have not entirely recovered from its effects but do look after the county treasurer's office even against the advice of my physician.

#### CHARLES W. ELLIS' RECORD

(Oregon Voter)

Introduced 21 measures covering a wide variety of subjects, including several introduced jointly with other senators and six of the 21 as chairman of the Senate Judiciary committee. A majority of his bills related to the correction and clarification of court procedure and were enacted on their merits. Was author of Senate joint memorial No. 1 to force the building of a railroad across central Oregon; joined with Senator Zimmerman in introduction of resolution for release of political prisoners; two bills for assertion of public rights in land; two insurance bills and a bounty bill; bill relating to articles of incorporation of foreign corporations and a livestock bill of interest to his district. As chairman of the Senate Judiciary committee, Senator Ellis demonstrated his grasp of legal procedure and did much to untangle matters relating to controversial points of law. Aggressive and fearless but not flippant; rather of a studious type, able and willing to examine critically all measures with a tendency to vote "No" if in doubt; always on the job, overlooking no opportunity to be of service to his constituents. Member of the Senate committee on Enrolled Bills, Alcoholic Traffic, Irrigation, Medicine, Pharmacy and Dentistry, besides being chairman of the Judiciary committee.

Senator Ellis was one of only two members of both houses to vote against Senator Eddy's bill regulating the selection of text books; one

of only five men of both houses to vote against passage of deficiency appropriation bill without its being printed.

One of only four men in both houses to vote against Senator Strayor's bill authorizing appeal to supreme court on reduction of assessments. He voted against Representative Woodward's bill for the education of sub-normals; against the master fish warden appropriation bill, for forbidding licensing of aliens in certain lines of business; for Senator Klepper's bill to place sheriffs and their deputies under protection of workmen's compensation act.

Voted against state income tax; for increasing the size of helper engine crews; against Senator Hall's bill for creation of municipal districts to finance and operate railroads and bus lines; for vehicle confiscation; against naturopathic bill; for licensing commission merchants; for creating office of state market agent; against anti-oleo bill; for placing two farmers on state game commission; against Mrs. Simmons' women-on-jury bill and against her bill requiring marriage examination of both sexes; for carrying bill placing state warrants on cash basis over Governor's veto; for killing bill impairing initiative and referendum; against extending tax supervising commissions to all Oregon counties; for classifying logged-off lands for taxation.

Senator Ellis combines with sound judgment an inclination to dig deep into the merits of all measures. He forms his opinions independent of other influences; is dependable and conscientious.
