

AUTO LICENSE

The following instructions have been issued from the office of the Secretary of State and mailed to sheriffs, police and other officers of the state.

Please be advised that the congestion of business in the Motor Vehicle Division of the Department of State of which you were advised on December 29, 1924 is now cleared up and that the department, from February 4, 1925, has been issuing licenses for all motor vehicles, motorcycles, chauffeurs, operators and dealers in motor vehicles on the day of the receipt of the applications therefor, except where it is found necessary to return them by reason of their not being properly executed or otherwise defective, and will continue to do so during the remainder of the year.

In view of the fact that the department, from this date, will issue all such licenses promptly, it takes this opportunity of apprising you thereof so that you may have official information regarding the same and, therefore, govern yourself accordingly in the enforcement of the provisions of the motor vehicle laws within your jurisdiction.

In all cases where motor vehicle owners desire to operate their motor vehicles before receiving a permanent license from the Secretary of State, application for 1925 licenses should be made through the sheriff of their own county and that official issue a temporary license to cover the operation of the vehicles during the interim. There is now no valid cause for any motor vehicle owner operating his car upon a 1924 license or without a proper motor vehicle license attached thereto. Any car now operated on the highways of Oregon should have affixed thereto permanent 1925 license or temporary tags, duly assigned thereto by the sheriff of his county, or the owner thereof possess conclusive evidence of having made due application for the 1925 permanent license.

In the event any questions arise at any time regarding the time of the issuing of any license plates, the department will be pleased to have you direct the same to its attention, as well as furnish you any information you may desire from time to time respecting the provisions of the motor vehicle laws or any motor vehicles which may be licensed thereunder.

By close cooperation between the various county, city, town and state officials in the enforcement of the motor vehicle license laws and traffic regulations of this state, it is possible to further improve them and bring about a condition that will insure safety in travel at all times, and to this end, as in the past, your efforts are earnestly invited.
