Oregon for Harney County, made and entered on the 29th day of January, 1925, as appears of record in the office of the County Clerk in and for the County of Harney in favor of C. A. Foster, plaintiff, and against Mabel S. Hooker and Arthur Hooker, husband and wife, and all other persons unknown claiming any right, title, estate or lien in the real property described herein, defendants, for the sum of \$182.11, with legal interest thereon which make the several totals which make up said sum of \$182.11 as shown by tax lien certificates and tax lien receipts, as shown hereafter, held by plaintiff from the 5th day of April, 1921, and with all legal interest thereon from the said date and the several different dates hereinafter set out, and for the further sum of \$7.50 costs of bringing abstract down to date;

SECOND. That three (3) years have elapsed prior to the commencement of this suit since the original date of delinquency of the taxes for the years 1919 and 1921, which are included in said certificates of delinquency.

THIRD. That plaintiff herein is the lawful holder of said certificates of delinquency.
