Ammonium sulphate, a common commercial fertilizer which is available in crystalline form from any deater in seed or fertilizer, is a good spray for the control of moss and weeds in the lawn, reports the Oregon experiment station. It is also a good fertilizer and stimulates the growth of grass. It is dissolved at the rate of 22 ounces to a gallon of water. Straining the spray through cheese cloth will remove particles of dirt which would clog up the apray




