O. A. C. FARM POINTERS

The earliest Oregon head lettuce is that grown to a state of solid heading in a cold frame, reports the experiment station. This crop, usually called frame lettuce, is much in demand in the spring and late fall. The plants invariably make fine solid plants in the field is usually early in March. The crop will begin to mature on about April 15.

Many Oregon fruit growers are constructing spray towers on their spray rigs in order to insure better protection from peats in the upper explains the experiment station. Most of the damage done by scab and worms has been on these unprotected parts in the past.

At this season Oregon potatoes in storage must be kept well ventilated to prevent sprouting, which the warmer weather is beginning to cause in many parts of the state, the experiment station has learned. If the potato piles are opened and the potatoes spread out, and the storage places are opened on cold nights and kept closed during the warmer perlod, the potatoes can be held in good seed condition for a longer period.




