

FORESTRY NOTES

There is a new regulation effective March 2, 1925, of considerable interest to National Forest Grazing permittees who have requested authority to rid the range of "fuss-tails."

Regulation T-11 Impounding of Livestock

"Domestic livestock found trespassing on National Forest Land if not removed upon reasonable notice may be impounded by the Forest Service. If the owner of the stock is known, prompt written notice of the impounding will be given him, and unless the stock be removed by the owner within five days from receipt of such notice the stock shall be sold or otherwise disposed of as herein-after prescribed. If the owner be not known, notice shall be given by publication for not less than fifteen days in a newspaper of general circulation in the county in which trespass occurs and concurrently by posting at the county courthouse. In either case the notice shall state when and where the stock was impounded, describe the stock by brands or other means of identification, and specify the time and place it will be sold in default of redemption by the owner. If the stock be not redeemed on or before the date fixed for its sale, it shall be sold at public sale to the highest bidder, or otherwise disposed of. The owner may redeem the stock by submitting proof of ownership and paying all expenses incurred by the United States in advertising, gathering, pasturing, and impounding it. Upon the sale of any stock in accordance with this regulation the Forest officer shall issue a certificate of sale. Any stock impounded under this regulation which is offered at public sale and no bid received therefor may, in the discretion of the Forest officer, be sold at private sale or be condemned and destroyed.

CONSOLIDATION OF SCHOOLS A GROWING TENDENCY

Country schools in the United States are being centralized with reasonable rapidity and increasing intelligence and forthrightness. According to estimates recently made in the Bureau of Education of the Department of the Interior, approximately 9 million children of the farm population and 3 million additional rural children living in small villages and other farm communities, in all 12 million children, are enrolled in schools which may properly be called rural. These schools are classified as follows: One, teacher schools of which there were at the close of 1924 about 155,000 enrolling approximately four and three-fourths million children; two, three, and four, teacher schools in the open country enrolling on the same date approximately one and one-half million children; schools in villages of 500 and under enrolling approximately two and one-fourth million children; consolidated schools enrolling approximately two and three-fourths million children, and three-fourths of a million rural children enrolled in schools of the larger towns and in others not included in above classification. It is also estimated that there are approximately 150,000 teachers now employed in 14,000 consolidated schools in the United States. That these children are receiving educational advantages superior in quality to those generally afforded by the small isolated schools of the one, two, and three, teacher type is generally acknowledged. Wherever feasible, there is a tendency, growing in strength and extent, to consolidate small rural schools.

WHEREAS, it was further ordered and decreed by said Court that plaintiff's said lien by reason of payment of said taxes on the following described real property situate in the County of Harney, State of Oregon, and more particularly described as follows, to-wit:

An undivided one-half of Section 16 in Township 30, Range 31, and also an undivided one-half of section 36 in Township 30, Range 30, East of the Willamette Meridian.

First: That there is now outstanding unredeemed certificates of delinquency numbered 3907 and 3913, issued on the 2nd day of February, 1923, and on the 17th day of May, 1923, respectively by the tax collector of the County of Harney, State of Oregon, for the amounts of Forty-six and 90-100 (\$46.90) Dollars, and Fifty-four and 98-100 Dollars. (\$54.98), respectively, the same being the amounts then due and delinquent of the taxes for the years 1919 and 1921 respectively, together with penalty, interest and costs.

SECOND. That three (3) years have elapsed prior to the commencement of this suit since the original date of delinquency of the taxes for the years 1919 and 1921, which are included in said certificates of delinquency.

THIRD. That plaintiff herein is the lawful holder of said certificates of delinquency. That plaintiff herein has paid all subsequent and prior taxes issued against said property, in all, including said certificates of delinquency, amounting to One Hundred Eighty-two and 11-100 Dollars (\$182.11). That there is now due plaintiff herein for said certificates of delinquency and taxes paid as aforesaid with interest thereon at the rate of twelve per cent (12%) per annum; the sum of One Hundred eighty-two and 11-100 Dollars (\$182.11), with interest on Forty-six and 90-100 Dollars (\$46.90), thereof from the 5th day of April, 1921; with interest on Fifty-four and 98-100 Dollars (\$54.98), thereof from the 17th day of May, 1923; with interest on Forty-two and 73-100 Dollars (\$42.73), thereof from April 5th, 1921 and with interest on Thirty-seven and 50-100 Dollars.
