STANDARD FORMULA FOR WHITE WASH

2198, take a balf bushel of unslacked lime, slake it with boiling water, cover during the process to keep in the steam, atrain the liquid through a fine sieve or strainer and add to it a peck of salt previously desolved in warm water and one pound of clean glue previously dissolved by soaking in cold water, and then hanging over a slow fire in a small pot hung in a larger one filled with water, add five gallons hot water to the mixture. Stir well and let stand a few days covered in a cool place, a pint of this mixture if properly applied will cover one square yard, preferably it should be applied warm.

This is the common standard formula for white wash taken from maintenance of way rule book, page 181, paragraph 2198, and used by the O. S. L.

> Auto tourist camps during the last ously in number so that now in the State of Oregon there are hundreds of camps. A number of these camps can be considered model camps such while many of them are merely cleared camping sites with no santtary provisions whatever. The Legislature of the State of Oregon, realizing that a stricter supervision of tourists' camps was necessary, enacted a law providing for the regular inspection of these camps. The tourist crops have an economic value to the community. While the money the tourists bring has attracted attention, the Oregon State Board of Health is concerned with the sort of health that these travelers bring into the State and the kind of health they acquire while within our boundaries. Any epidemic arising in a camp would be an unfortunate occurrence.






