The Musical and Dramatic Concert.

Quite an entertaining and talented little affair was gotten up for a holiday amusement for the people, by the principal of the Burns school M. N. Fogly, on the 29th of December, and, as it happened, we were unable to make a full report of it until to-day, but, it is not having been published before, will be now.

The door opened about 7 o'clock, and performance began at 7:30.

The hall was well supplied with seats, and well-lighted, but owing to the extreme cold weather and the hall altogether unprovided with means of heating, it was too cold for general enjoyment either on the stage or in the audience. The stage was handsomely carpeted and decorated, and the arrangement of the properties skilfully done.
