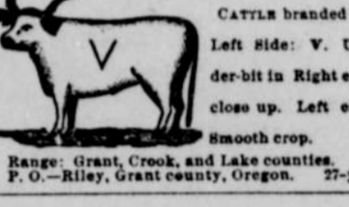

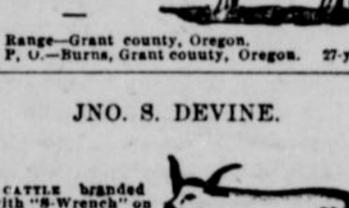
Horses branded on either Right or Left side: O.K. Range: Grant county, Oregon.

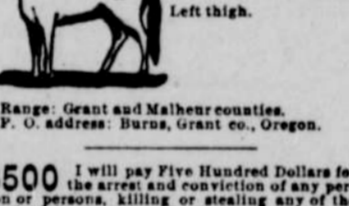
Horses branded on Left Side: Horizontal Double-8. Range: Grant county, Oregon.

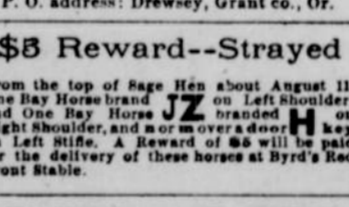
