OREGON STATE WEATHER BUREAU.

[In co-operation with U. S. Signal Service.] [Special to THE OREGON HERALD.] CENTRAL OFFICE, Portland, Or., For Week Ending May 4, 1889.

Another week of warm showers and an average amount of sunshine has been experienced throughout the major portion of the state, proving of great benefit to the growing crop. First three days were warm and almost cloudless; last four had alternately clouds, sunshine and showers. On Thursday, almost a continuous light rain.

Ground is now thoroughly soaked to the subsoil, and there is no danger from a drouth, even if one should occur, injuring the crops; soil is in good condition to withstand the dry season, and now more danger is from too much that too little rainfall. On the low lands in sections of the Willamette Valley the copious rains of late have retarded the planting of corn and late gardens and have had an injurious effect on wheat causing it to grow slender. The finest of growing weather prevailed during the week. Vegetables of all kind very beautiful, strawberries ripening rapidly and cherries assuming the rosy tinge indicating they too will soon be ripe.

A strong wind prevailed along the middle Columbia River basin Wednesday, doing slight damage. The rainfall has been about the normal in all sections of the State, being of special benefit in Eastern Oregon to the wheat crops and in Southern Oregon to the grazing industry, where it has given the hay and native grasses a fine start.

Not sufficient rain has fallen yet to raise the streams to float logs to the mills; in consequence many mills are idle.

The temperature has been about normal with no very great extremes, a nice thunder storm prevailed in the northern part of the Willamette Valley on Wednesday.

Reports of the correspondents show an improved condition of all crops and the flattering prospect of immense yield of cereals, fruits, &c, continue.
