Army, has conon the Mortality and Vital Statistics of the United States as returned by the Eleventh Census. <br> As the United States has no system of registration of vital statisties, such as relied upon by other civilized nations for the purpose of ascertaining the actual muvement of population, our census affords the only opportunity of obtaining near an approximate estimate of the birth and death rates of much the larger part of the country, which is entirely unprovided with any satisfactory system of State and municipal registration.
