As Reported by a Late Visitor Here in the Roseburg Review.

Harney Valley is a beautiful valley in Eastern Oregon in Harney county, between 118 and 120 degrees West Longitude from Greenwich and between 43 and 44 degrees North Latitude, about 3,500 feet above the level of the sea, with an area of about 2500 square miles, containing 1,000,000 acres of land.

This valley is nestled in a broken chain of mountains on the north-east, south and west with the highest peaks of the Blue mountains on the north and the Steen mountains on the south, towering up into the realms of perpetual snow.

AN ABUNDANCE of water supplied by the Silves and Blitzen rivers and their tributaries, and other smaller streams, all of which have their outlets in the Malheur and Harney lakes.

NOT NECESSARY to raise crops and gardens. The soil here contains all the properties necessary to make a successful grain growing country.

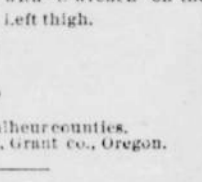

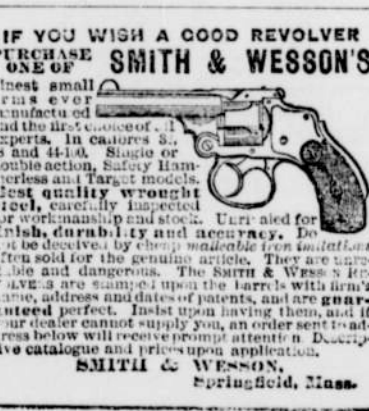
ALMEDA A. STENGER. CATTLE branded on Left side: circle 2. A split in each ear.
