12 m—Very warm, electricity, short sprinklings of rain, slight thunder and lightning.
6 p m—Quite warm. Heaviest dust storms of the season all afternoon, the wind at its greatest high at 4 o'clock. Calm at 8.
Monday: 6 a m—Cool, cloudy.
12 m—Very warm.
6 p m—Cool. One of the most violent winds prevailed between 4:30 and 5:20 that has visited the town the past two years, an enormous cloud of dust advancing rapidly from the southeast and obscuring everything, momentarily, from view within five feet of the observer, as it swept through.
