-Prineville is experimenting with mumps and ja gripe together.
-The Sisters section of East Oregon reports 73 days snow on the ground.
-A three weeks revival in Prineville and vicinity, in January, yielded five persons.
-The Dalles fine new opera house opened, Feb. 3-4, with "Harbor Lights," by a Frisco Company.
-The widow of Rev. Bonebrake, deceased, at Goldendale, while preparing to go to church, suddenly expired, aged 75 years.
