Burns Free Edition.

An Important Matter.

It appears that in making application to Williams & Wood, at Portland, for the purchase of land and town property, owned by the W. V. & C. M. Wagon Road Co., many errors in description, acreage, numbers of lots, and amount of purchase have been made. These are mainly caused by the applicants not using the form of application issued by the company. The forms are so prepared that the possibilities of error are greatly lessened. Messrs. Williams & Wood, the attorneys for the company, will hereafter refuse to pass upon any application unless it be made upon the regular forms which they provide, and which can be had from P. F. Stenger in Burns, or of Thornton Williams in Harney.

Among the requirements of the applications are the following:

"The application is made subject to the following conditions and instructions, which the applicant will read. Local agents are not authorized to make contracts, sales or leases, and no transaction will in any case be recognized as an agreement to lease, or as a contract for the sale of lands, or lots, until approved by the attorneys of the owners, at Portland, Oregon. The purchaser must rely upon his own knowledge of the land, and not upon any representation made by others as to its character. The application must be signed by the applicant, and sent by him, with the necessary amount of money, addressed to Williams & Wood, Portland, Oregon. The company or its assigns will not be responsible for any money until it is received at the office of Williams & Wood. If the application is not approved, the money received will be returned. Contracts are made in duplicate; one sent to the purchaser for his signature, and when this is returned, properly signed, the duplicate of the same, duly executed on the part of the Company, will be sent to the purchaser. Applicants should be particular to give their full address so that all communications may reach them safely, and without delay."
