October 7th, 1890.

banks of the Olally. Before leav-
ing our midst, the captain present-
ed the Boat Ford school with a fine
opera glass.

Dr. Emflee and son, Clyde, will
take a trip to the John Day coun-
try soon, in search of a winters
supply of fruit and vegetables.

Every few days teams, loaded
with lumber, pass through Silvies
City, destined for the lake country.

John Embree, who recently vis-
ited Malheur lake, reports Mr. El-
liott's garden to be immense, and is
of the opinion that at an early
period the lake country will be a
fine vegetable country, especially
of the root variety. John himself
has had some experience in that
line of culture, and he is fully con-
vinced that roots of an enormous
size can be raised on land located
near the lake.

Silvies City was white-washed
on the 2d of this month with frost
and alkali.
