**Opposed to a Third Party.**

A. S. Hall, president of the Missouri Farmer's Alliance, is strongly opposed to a third party movement, and will bitterly denounce a movement of that nature when the convention assembles in Cincinnati, this month.

**Seal Fishing in Behring Sea.**

It seems, from present indications, that seal fishing in Behring Sea, this summer, will be free to all. The commanders of revenue cutters will receive the usual orders, but will be furnished with private and confidential instructions not to molest any vessel sealing within the jurisdictional limit of three miles from shore.

**Slavin Makes a Match.**

Billy Madden says he has made an agreement with Dick Boche on behalf of the Granite Club, whereby Frank Slavin will meet Jake Kilrain in Hoboken, for a purse of \$10,000. He says he has also arranged that Slavin will meet the winner of the Corbett-Jackson fight in San Francisco.

Madden says that the reason he sent Slavin to meet Sullivan face to face was because Sullivan would pay no attention to telegrams sent directly to him. He did not say, though, that it would be impossible to get an answer from him if a responsible man in St. Louis or Cincinnati had been deputised by wire to get an answer from him.

June 16 was selected as the date of the contest between Kilrain and Slavin.

**A Bellamy Experiment.**

A Los Angeles gentleman has been investigating with rather startling results the Kaweah colony, in Tulare county, Cal., which was established some three years ago ostensibly to carry out the community ideas set forth by Mr. Bellamy. Haskell & Martin were the founders of the colony. Martin managed the business on the ground, and Haskell did the advertising and drumming by means of a magazine started by him in the concern. They set forth that the colony owned 5,000 acres of the best of land, and that any one could become a member by the payment of \$500, \$100 cash and the balance in \$5 monthly installments. Hundreds of people bit at the tempting bait and hurried to invest their little all in the model community, where the welfare of each was the care of all. The workers were not paid in money, but in the time checks gotten up by Haskell, which entitled the holder to goods bought from the colony store, i. e., from Martin's at a slight advance over cost price. Thousands of dollars of this worthless paper has been issued, and many have nothing else to show for their three years' labor. It is estimated that the enterprising originators of the project are clearing \$3,000 a month out of it.

**No Use for Mormons.**

For two years past several Mormon elders have been preaching their doctrines in the upper part of Lincoln county, W. Va., proselyting quite a number of members from other denominations and securing large numbers. The elders are well educated and always ready for a debate with any minister who would accept their challenge. By this means the elders stirred up a good deal of discord and made themselves quite obnoxious to the people other than of their own belief. Last week matters reached a climax when fifty horsemen rode up to a house at which the elders were stopping and ordered them to leave the neighborhood forthwith. The elders pleaded to be let alone, but they were started on the trot and followed the county line in the back counties of that section. Many of the people have listened to the Mormon elders and have disposed of their little possession and gone west. It is generally among the poorer class that the elders gain their converts.
