> It is said at the State department that there has been no suggestion of arbitration of the "difficulties between Italy and the United States growing out of the New Orleans tragedy as was reported in a special dispatch from Rome. Arbitration is the last resort after diplomacy has failed, and as Secretary Blaine has promised to consider the claims for imdemnity, it cannot be held that the diplomatic stage has been passed. The rather indiscreet utterances of the Italian consul at New Orleans relative to the conspiracy to kill the mayor and other promanent persons causes some amusement at the Department, but as they have not taken an official shape no notice will be taken of them by our Government.

The Secretary of the Interior has under consideration the advisability of surveying the southern and eastarn boundary lines of the Yellow Stone National Park, and also the boundary lines of the timber reservation which was authorized by the act of March 3, 1891, and located by executive proclamation of March 30, 1891. While no specific appropriations for these surveys have been made by Congress, it is believed that the expense of the same may be made and charged to the appropriation made for the survey of public lands.
