### Eyes of a Severed Head Open.

A Negannee special to the Detroit Free Press says: A brakeman named Thomas Higgins slipped down between two freight cars on a moving train near Maple Ridge. The signal to stop was given by another brakeman who saw the fall and the train backed up to where Higgins lay. Five cars passed over his body which was frightfully mangled. The head was completely severed from the trunk and lay several from the track. Fireman Byo picked up the head and was horror stricken to see the eyelids close and again open, then partly close again. This was seen by Engineer William Whitney and the brakeman, and all three were badly frightened. This sign of consciousness was given several minutes after the head was severed from the body.

The absolute ignorance of our language and history, and of all our political traditions and institutions, and the total want of fitness of them of a vast number of the best foreign population of the city, is a evil which immediately accuses the government by its vote a mere commodity. of the Hungarian towns of Pennsylvania this is well understood as it is easier for unscrupulous partisan politicians to buy votes to instruct them, and to have their terror of alienating the tongues of public ally and the country, drifts along, deploring secretly what it is apparently afraid to withstand openly.—Harper's Weekly.
