Atchison, Kas., June 4—John J. Ingalls came down town, to-day, in his old spring wagon to have a plow sharpened. His pataloons were tucked in his boot-tops, and his gray coat and slouch white hat bore evidence of the rain of yesterday. He was pretty muddy.

Harry Shumaker, chairman of the alliance central committee, gazed at the elongated ex-Senator for a moment and said: "I have been a farmer for forty years, but I ain't in it with Ingalls."

A reporter stopped Mr. Ingalls on the street and asked him if he was going to take Secretary Noble's place in the Cabinet.

"My dear sir," replied Mr. Ingalls, "I'm getting to old to go to Washington to be a private clerk for President Harrison," and then the iridescent statesman drove on toward his truck farm without another word.—Republic.

A Murder over a Card Game Results in a Quadruple Tragedy.

On the Grand Bay plantation, in Coupee Parish, a number of negroes were engaged in a game of cards, when a dispute arose among them which resulted in the killing of Willie Jennings, a laborer, by Sam Hummel.

Levee hands at once organized themselves into a body for the purpose of avenging the murder of Jennings. This resulted in the hanging of Alex Campbell, Sam Hummel and another negro whose name was not learned.

### MARRIED QUITE OFTEN.

Married Four Times Before Twenty.

Married at 12, again at 13, a third time at 14, and a fourth at 20, states part of life story of rosy-cheeked, brown-eyed Kate Mott Nugent, whose trial for bigamy ended at Riverside, L. I., Tuesday, with a disagreement of the jury. Kate first married George Gregory to escape being driven from home. Without the formality of a divorce she became a year later the wife of Frank Fox. She lived with neither of these husbands, but Fox secured a divorce because of her youth. At 14 she married Lincoln Nugent, who abandoned her after a child had been born to them, claiming the marriage was illegal. Then her hand was sought by Oliver W. Petty, of Port Jefferson. She consulted counsel and was told, so she says that she had never been a legal wife and was free to marry Petty, who is the twenty-year old son of rich parents. She married him and was arrested for bigamy.
