PUNISHMENT PREVENTS CRIME.

Where the death penalty has been altogether or almost abolished murder has increased in an extraordinary degree. In Belgium murders increased in a frightful manner whenever the knowledge of the abolition of the scaffold spread among the masses. From 1865 to 1880 murders increased from 31 to 120. In Prussia, where for many years there had been no executions, murders increased from 242 in 1854 to 518 in 1880. In Switzerland, where capital punishment was abolished in 1874, murders increased in five years in the proportion of 75 per cent. The same effect was produced in France and Italy. How will the modern crank, who holds that punishment is not reformatory and that the death penalty is not a deterrent of murder, account for these facts?

AN AMERICAN MOVEMENT.

A semi-secret meeting was held at Baltimore, a few nights ago, at which stirring speeches were made in favor of keeping America for Americans. The effort of the people of other nationalities to overthrow the government and institutions of the United States, such as the working and doings of the Mafia, Anarchists, Socialists, etc., were commented on as examples of what may happen if immediate steps are not taken to prevent complications which are inevitable when men of different nations attempt to govern the affairs of state. Said one speaker: "Every office holder in the United States, whether he be a government, state, or city official, should be a native-born American. There are thousands of offices filled to-day with refugees from other countries, while people who were bred and born on American soil, are walking around vainly seeking employment. Time has come for action."

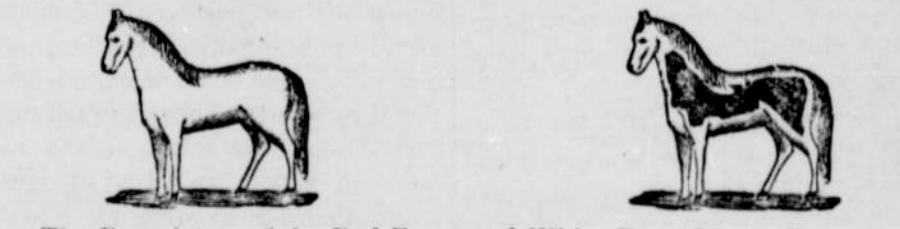
