**NEWS IN BRIEF.**

**THE NEWS OF THE WORLD AS CULLED FROM EXCHANGES.**

A series of unearthly noises in the vicinity of a Mount Holly (N J) cemetery, gave rise to ghost stories; but investigation showed that it was a man with a new bass horn.

On the 1st, inst., Anduboin county, Iowa, was visited by a cyclone. The damage to crops was very heavy. A large number of houses were blown down, quite a number of persons injured and one man killed.

Horrible cruelties in Chili are still perpetrated by Balmaeda; people, without respect to sex, age or condition, who are suspected, are shot down like dogs. The tortures to which he subjects his prisoners are truly heart rendering.

Carpenters Union, No. 22, of San Francisco, has learned that certain employers of their craft are trying to destroy the eight-hour day system. The matter will be laid before the Builder's Association, and if the grievance is not abated trouble is promised.

On the night of the 2nd a boy aged 16, named Charley Pruves, of Talent Oregon, hanged himself with a log chain. It is said the act was caused by disappointment in not getting some articles of clothing he wanted from his parents for the 4th.

The swells of New York now drink iced buttermilk. It is taken "straight," but is called a buttermilk cock-tail for bar-room effect.

Our exchanges report Secretary Blaine a very sick man. His physicians say that he is in a dangerous condition, his voice has lost its strength, and he easily becomes hoarse and coughs very frequently, his memory has also suffered very much. Rumor among his friends says he cannot remember an event a week old.

A father and son, named Johnson, residing near Lakeville, Minn., were shot and killed, while defending their own property, by a notorious horse thief, 3d inst. A companion of the latter also shot and wounded Mrs. Johnson, who rushed to the assistance of her husband and son. They escaped, but will be lynched if captured.

Mrs. Mary Ellen Lease, of the farmers' alliance in Kansas, speaking of the murder of Colonel Sam Wood said: "It is the work of this infamous republican crowd, who cannot beat us fair, but take the assassin's work in hand to put us out of the way. Judge Botkin is responsible for the murder of Sam Wood. They tried to kill me, and failed and now I see by special dispatches that they are trying to reach the mother through her children. Three times have they tried to put them out of the way with poisoned lemonade, and three times have they failed." Sam Wood was not the man some people have pictured him. He was a valuable man to Kansas. His assassins can't kill his memory.
