NEWS IN BRIEF.

THE NEWS OF THE WORLD AS
CULLED FROM EXCHANGES.

On July 6th a cyclone damaged the penitentiary at Baton Rouge La., killing ten of the inmates and wounding 40 others. Fifty buildings were badly damaged among them the Governors mansion. The damage to the penitentiary is estimated at \$30,000.

In Ohio July 4th two fatal balloon accidents occurred.

Two men fell from a balloon at New Lisbon and were killed and one lady, at Elyria while attempting to make an ascent when the wind was blowing, was dragged through several trees and fell when sixty feet from the ground. She was instantly killed.

Says the Republic: The Pennsylvania politicians report that the revolt against Quay, ring rule and bossism is wide spread enough in the state to shake the foundation of the republican party if Quay continues at the head. People of Pennsylvania can stand a great deal of rascality as long as it is kept a secret but even long custom cannot make them all callous enough to endure the disgrace of exposure and scandal without protest.

The oldest living triplets we have any account of live in Somney town Pa. They are 77 years old and never spent but one night away from home. Their names are Rebecca Benjamin and Samuel Roller.

Jackson, Miss., July 6--Voters under the new Constitution of Mississippi must register four months before the next election. On July 6 registration closed, and sufficient returns have been received to make it reasonably certain that for the first time since reconstruction days a majority of the legal voters of the State are white.--The Republic.

Paris, July 7.--Agents of the Chilean Congressional party state that advices from Chili warrant confidence that the Congressional troops will occupy Santiago within a month. They resume the campaign amply provided with rifles and field guns. It is probable the plan of the Congressional generals is to land between Valparaiso and Lazerena, crush the main body of Balmacedists, rouse the people and make a combined movement on Santiago.--Oregonian.
