## NEWS IN BRIEF.

### THE NEWS OF THE WORLD AS CULLED FROM EXCHANGES.

George Francis Train, who is completing his circuit of the globe in a race against time, hoped to complete his trip around the world in fifty-five days, but this is not possible as he still has 3,000 miles to go.

An exchange says that Texas has a Hog for governor, a Pig for judge, a Lamb for senator, a Durham for representative and a Buffalo for sheriff.

It is reported that the black republic of Hayti, is likely to be the scene of another bloody rebellion. Such is the bitter hatred and opposition to Hyppolite that an outbreak is likely to occur at any time. Many residents are so fearful of impending insurrection they are leaving in all haste.

Cheyenne, Wyo., July 7.—Portions of Cheyenne county are being overrun by grasshoppers. A strip of country ten miles wide is completely hidden from view by the insects. They settle on railroad tracks and impede trains. As yet they have done no damage to crops as they are to young. By the time they are able to fly they will be well out of Wyoming into Kansas.—East Oregonian.

Bismark says that unless Von Munster, the German ambassador at Paris, denies the story reported by Deblowitz to the effect that the late Emperor was desirous of getting rid of him and that the advancement of Herbert Bismark, his son, was a glaring instance of nepotism in politics, he, Count Bismark, will challenge the German ambassador to give him satisfaction on the field of honor.

The leaders of the Farmers Alliance move, in Minn., are accused of an outrageous swindle which is likely to cause a rupture in the organization in that state. There has been a great reduction in the price of twine in that state the last year or two which the farmers supposed was brought about through the action of the alliance. Later developments show conclusively that the alliance traders bought a cheap article of sisal twine, at a very low rate, and had it colored the color of the pure manilla, the best twine in the market, and sold it to the farmers for pure manilla, thereby making an enormous profit at the expense of the farmer.

The farmers are very indignant and there is a fair showing for the whole organization in the state to succumb in the storm that has been raised.
