THE NEWS OF THE WORLD AS CULLED FROM EXCHANGES.

Mrs. Jefferson Davis decides in favor of Richmond, the confederacy's capital, for the final resting place of her husband's remains. She briefly reviews the claims of the various other States, and urges the fact that in the fullness of fame he did not belong to any part of the country, but in Richmond he received generous and unwavering support in the darkest hours of the South's defeat.

Topeka, Kas., July 13.—The indications are that the Alliance will split on the subtreasury scheme. The action of the Texas convention is a general topic of conversation here, and the views of the Alliance leaders are as diverse as those of the members of different organizations. President McGrath of this State is lukewarm on the subtreasury plan and in sympathy with the Missouri Alliance president, U. S. Hall, in his fight on Dr. Macune. Dr. McLallin, editor of the Alliance Advocate, declares that the Texas convention does not represent the Alliance in that State and that the Texas State president has revoked the commissions of the lecturers who signed the call for the convention. Mr. Hall of Missouri is not an Alliance man, but a Democratic politician, Dr. McLallin declares. He says the Kansas Alliance is practically a unit on the subtreasury plan, while others of the Alliance leaders say that only one of the State lecturers, S. N. Scott of McPherson is making a fight for it.—The Republic.

The Democratic party of Kansas which many supposed had gone out of business and handed over its effects to the new People's party, shows signs of revival, and, to judge from recent events, proposes to no longer give aid and comfort to this new movement. The meeting of Democratic editors, held to discuss the pending local campaigns of this year, but more especially to talk over the situation for next year, was very significant, inasmuch as it was composed largely of the men who direct and shape the policy of the party in Kansas. The refusal of the alliance to form a coalition with the Democrats in the Presidential campaign of 1892, aroused such a storm of indignation in the Democratic ranks, that they are determined to "keep in the middle of the road" and fight for straight democracy. In that event, between the fire of the democrats and the republicans, the People's party is likely to travel a very rocky road before November, 1892.
