THE NEWS OF THE WORLD AS TULLED FROM EXCHANGES.

Harry Curtiss, a glass worker, 18 years old, was found dead in bed, July 13. An autopsy showed the heart paralyzed, caused by excessive use of cigarettes, he having been in the habit of smoking four boxes daily.

Mrs. Lucy Pratt, a young widow of San Francisco, sold 45 square inches of her skin for \$100. A strip of skin 9x5 inches was cut from her body by surgeons and grafted on the leg of William Dagget, who was injured in a railroad accident.

A singular character resides near Irasburg, Vt. She has not allowed a human to look upon her in daylight, for forty years. Her name is Ann Dennis, and she took up this singular abode of life immediately after the death of her mother, whom she accuses herself of killing by giving an over dose of some opiate.

Mrs. Jane Leland, a woman of 60, and connected with some of the best families in Pennsylvania, lies in the Erie county jail, raving mad. Her son was recently sent to prison for stealing cattle, and the mother swore vengeance upon all who had anything to do with his conviction. Witnesses and jurors since then have been pursued by a common nemesis and their horses and cattle have been killed by poison. Suspicion resulted in detection. Mrs. Leland and her daughter, when arrested, fought desperately with axes, but were overpowered.

July 15 was pardon day at the State house. The governor commuted the sentence of four prisoners. The life sentence of Wm. B. Eldings, who was sentenced from Douglas county, for murder in the second degree, who has been in prison since Jan. 1st 1884. David Cameron from Multnomah, July 13 1889, sentenced for three years for the crime of larceny. A. Hill convicted of manslaughter, sentenced from Linn November 8 1889 for ten years. The fourth was R. A. Burneys from Multnomah sent up for eight years for arson, has been in prison since May 5th 1887.

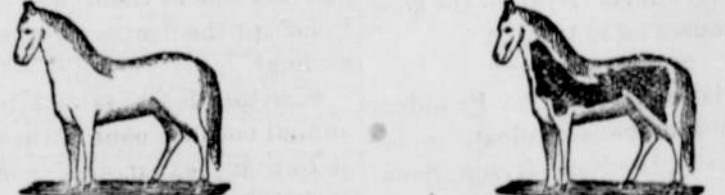
