Proceedings of the Democratic County Convention.

Pursuant to a call of the democratic central committee of Harney county the convention in and for Harney county Oregon met in Burns Tuesday the 5th inst.

Meeting called to order by T. V. Embree, chairman of the democratic county committee. T. V. B. Embree was chosen temporary chairman, J. D. Daly temporary secretary. After a very nice little speech from the chairman the following committees were appointed: COMMITTEE ON CREDENTIALS: Simon Lewis, Benton Embree and W. Moffett.

Committee on order of business. Report on committee of resolution: We, your committee beg leave to submit the following report:

RESOLVED: by the democrats of Harney county state of Oregon in convention assembled: FIRST. That we endorse the administration of Sylvester Pennoyer Governor of Oregon.

SECOND. That in the selection of delegates to the state convention, to select all representative democrats and further we endorse W. C. Byrd for the office of Joint Representative of Harney and Grant counties

THIRD. That we bitterly oppose fraud or any dishonorable means used, if any such there be, in securing a nomination of any county officer and deem it obligatory on our chairman, also the delegates to expose all such if he or they have evidence it exists.

For treasurer Chas. Zeigler and T. H. Roberts were placed in nomination, Chas. Zeigler received the nomination on first ballot.

For Assessor Jas. Dalton, R. J. Ivers, T. A. McKinnon, S. W. Miller and J. C. Parker: On the second ballot S. W. Miller was declared the nominee having received a majority of all votes cast.

J. L. Cross and Thos. Walls were placed in nomination for the office of County Commissioner, Thos. Walls receiving a majority of all votes cast was declared the nominee.

Prof. D. L. Grace received the nomination of county school superintendent by acclamation, E. J. Martin the office of county surveyor by acclamation. C. F. McKinney the office of coroner by acclamation.
