The lecture Saturday night, by Mr. Luce, on reform and the protection of the farmer and laborer, reminds us of the evils of the political machinery of our government. But how are we to remedy the evils? We admit that the intention of the farmers organization and laborers generally, is a necessary move for protection and one to which no sane man who desires a healthy and impartial administration of political affairs and the making and enforcing of such laws as will give each and every American citizen equal rights and privileges, can object. And further while they go to extremes in some respects, in the main, what they ask for is nothing more than their due. But can this reformation be brought about more speedily and to the satisfaction of all concerned, by springing a third party? Or could not these organizations with the same amount of labor in their respective parties arrive at better and quicker results? Every one will have to admit that in a third party movement political demagogues will slip into its ranks and take their places as near the front ranks as it is possible for them to get and spoil every effort made in the direction of reform and for the time being the movement falls far short of the mark the laborer and farmer so much covets. Some will argue that every effort possible has already been made by the people to crush out the shysters and leeches, who are sapping the life-blood of the people, without effect. We say not, laborers and farmers are too apt to fall in with their bosses and allow themselves to be voted like so many cattle. That is the greatest obstacle in the path of reformation, and the main one that is dragging our people down to slavery and gradually riveting the

chains that binds us to the corporations and monied powers.

Now we ask in the name of all justice, fairness and honor will a third party add firmness to an individual who all his life has been ruled and voted by a boss? Teach men in your organizations to be more firm and vote according to their interest and conscientious convictions of right and justice to themselves, and we will accomplish more in one year, than will ever be accomplished in which all the "sore heads" of the nation will try to crowd to forward their own political aspirations without any regard for the interest or welfare of the people at large. A third party will have to be, or is made of the rank and file of the two old parties, and how can you expect any better results by giving them another name. In conclusion we say teach the voter to be firm, to stand by his rights and interest, not to be influenced by that element in our midst whose sole purpose is self, and makes tools of the laborer and farmer to accomplish its ends.
