NEWS IN GENERAL

FROM ALL PARTS OF THE WORLD

The Iroquois News says a wonderful freak of nature is now on exhibition at Geo. Caloran's. It is a calf which was given to him to stuff and mount with two perfect heads, two bodies and two tails. The two bodies are joined at the shoulders and come together at the terminus of the backbones, where the back bones join each other, forming the letter V. The tail at the stump is one large tail which divides into two within about four inches of the end. It has but one stomach, which was fed from both mouths, but only one discharge. It had two hearts, two sets of lungs, liver, lights, &c. One side of the least is male, while the other is female. Had the mother of this least not been killed for beef there is no doubt that the animal would have been born alive. The cow belonged to Mr. Joseph Steacy of the 2nd concession, and was killed for beef prior to the calf's maturity.

WALPACA, Wis., April 9 — At last four arrests have been made in the Mead murder case upon indictments returned by the grand jury. The men under arrest are Alfred R. Lea, member of the legislature; Sam Stout, Alfred Poll and David Holmes, all of this city. Stout is charged with being a principal in the murder, and Lea, Poll and Holmes as accessories, Lea being charged with being accessory after the fact and having had knowledge of the crime since November 22, 1890. Mead was a banker and was shot and killed in his bank in Oct. 1882. The murderers took \$10,000 in bonds and \$20,000 in money. For ten years the crime has been a factor in the social, political and religious life of this community. It has been whispered that several leading citizens committed the murder. The town has been divided into factions, and the arrests are the results of hard work by a special grand jury. Tab Ervor has been arrested at Rhinelander as a principal. He is a commission merchant and lived here at the time. The mystery is in a fair way to be solved. — Telegram.

ROCKFORD, Ill., April 7 — W. H. Guy, a restaurant-keeper, Dodson, a shooting gallery man and Hirman Silver, a diver of this city, pooled \$400 and invested in eastern green goods through an advertisement. Guy and Dodson went to a town in New York state and were scientifically relieved of their \$400 on a promise to ship the goods by express. They are still waiting for

the consignment. Silver is wondering whether he has been skinned by his partners or by the counterfeiter.

Albany Democrat: It is reported that the Oregon Pacific will, on account of the present contest going on, economize in the running of the road and the ocean steamers. Already the stevedores at Yaquina have been discharged, and the force according to the report will be cut down where possible. One scheme is to run but one train from the Bay to the front, thus doing away with one train, a move it is to be hoped will not be consummated. In regard to the legal contest going on there is undoubtedly only one thing that will settle matters to sailing smoothly at an early date, and that is a compromise between the Hogg faction and the Blair bondholders by which it will be taken out of the courts. Though Judge Deady's order permits the transfer to Zeph Job, it will probably not be done so long as the contest is going on.

LOUISVILLE, April 9 — In the last forty-eight hours about fifteen deluded, penniless and half-starved colored men have arrived in this city, from the East, whither they went in answer to a call for laborers. They are being cared for and fed in a hall controlled by the blacks. President Ray, of the Pine Mountain Coal and Iron Company, has offered them employment at Pineville. He wants them to work in the mines. The miners employed there struck over a week ago because a reduction had been made in their wages. The Pine Mountain Mine Company tried to employ a number of negroes from Tennessee, but failed. The Tennessee miners were all Knights of Labor.

GUTHRIE, O. T., April 5 — Late cold snaps and storms have caused a great loss of cattle in the territory. In the Chickasaw country the losses are 20 per cent. In the Creek country hundreds are dying daily. In Comanche and Iowa reservations the loss is the greatest. Thousands have died and are still dying fast.

WASHINGTON, April 5 — Word has come direct from the Chinese legation that if the bill passed by the house yesterday became a law it would be so offensive as to cause retaliatory measures to be taken. It is proposed to drive every American out of China and to adopt such other means of reprisal as may seem necessary.
