WE ARE not here to throw dirt on the republican nominees, because we do not consider they deserve it. and to stand by and submit to such is doing damage to our manhood and honest intentions, but when our ticket is not the result of a political fraud injurious to the people, we should support it.

Never desert your colors because some particular friend failed to receive the nomination for the office he desired. If you believe in the principles of your party, remember you are cutting off your own nose every time you vote contrary to those principles, unless you know your party has endorsed a man unworthy and through fraud he received the nomination.

THE farmers alliance have formed several organizations in our county. Quite a number who are favorable to that organization, met in convention in our town last Saturday. From what we learn of the proceedings it is not their intention to put out a ticket but to approve such candidates on both the democratic and republican tickets as coincide with their opinion of what constitutes men worthy of support. Several of both parties were endorsed, the officers, however, of joint representative and treasurer new men were recommended. We hope good results will spring from this effort at reform, and we have no doubt but that good will be accomplished if the prime movers have at heart the good of the people and not mere sectional prejudice which of ten crops out in such organizations and gives the death blow to the people's hope of freedom from the grip of monopolies, corporations and that ring rule which has for its object the advancement of the rich at the expense of the farmer and laborer.

The impression there is that the minister may as well make his arrangements to leave, unless he can persuade Mr. Harrison to veto the bill, as it is expected to go through the Senate with a relative majority as large as it received in the House.

THE Items speaks as if the "bosses" of the democratic party were not altogether pleased with the ticket. We are not aware that the democracy of Harney county acknowledges any "boss" while we have acknowledged leaders, men of ability and to whose advice we give ear and attention, but most undoubtedly we do not consider them in the light of a dictator or boss. Democracy is free and independent; its followers are not expected to "toady" to any creed, ring or dictator but to pursue a course of conduct suited to the wishes and best interests of the people. It is a pity the republican party cannot say so much of itself, but alas! It has

submitted so long to ring rule and absolute control of its "bosses" that it is now in throes of despair and crying out: "Help! Help! or I perish!"

THE chairman of the republican convention, last Friday was so much elated and rejoiced over the unexpected honor, he could not confine himself to the narrow limits of county politics but soared aloft and in his effort to make a "break," which he always does, ran square against Grover Cleveland crushing the bones of his own anatomy, Cleveland smilingly receiving the shock without damage just like all honest democrats.
