OR HUNDRED TONS ON HAY IN FLAMES.

A communication, under the ve caption, appears in the West e Mail, a paper published in San cisco. The article is dated ns Oregon and signed A. S. erbusch. The writer fails to the fact that all questions have sides. All of us are aware of fact that many men can only be faults and shortcomings of ybody and everything when or it does not exactly suit their s of proper arrangement. The per of the article referred too is of these kind of individuals. subject is the eviction cases etime since of settlers who had

made filings on the Red-S. land south of Burns 15 or 20 miles. He writes: "Nearly a whole township of high and dry arable land in Harney Valley was reported to the General Land Office as swamp, but afterwards Secretary Vilas on account of the voluminous evidence transmitted to the Department declared the report a fraud and settlers were allowed to file homestead and preemption claims on the land." The first report was approved by Secretary Teller, and that report declared a fraud by Secretary Vilas, both having the same authority. The writer goes on and states that Henry Miller & Co. claimed all said land and the settler was drawn into court by the land syndicate, "and says: "An ordinary man has no more chance in our courts, contending with a millionaire, than a newborn infant would have in the den of a wolf." He then goes on to state as a matter of course the judge decided in favor of the millionaire and decided the land was swamp because the syndicate said it was swamp and uses the following phrase "a question of fraud was immaterial, irrelevant and incompetent;" this little part of speech he learned from Cap. Waters and Chas. Parrish. It's a wonder he hadn't ended by saying "the attorney for the plaintiff objects."

The writer of the article does not inform the public that Henry Miller & Co. have deeds to the land called Red S. recorded in the clerk's office upon which he based his claim, he don't seem to understand that it was not a question of swamp or no swamp but one of title. Judge Clifford was not a swamp land agent, neither was he the State of Oregon which gave the right and title to Hen. Owens, neither was he the U. Government, which approved the land to the state, he was just simply a judge on the bench to investigate the title given to Hen Owens, and the deed from him to Todhunter & Co. and Henry Miller & Co. the successor of Todhunter, he found a perfect chain of title from the Government to the state from the state to Hen. Owens, thence to the other firms mentioned. In the presence of these deeds staring him in the face how could Judge Clifford decide otherwise? How could a jury render any other decision? And why should the writer heap anathemas upon the heads of the present owners for defending what they consider a just claim to said land. Were they to blame for buying the land?

Why not let our curses and anathemas fall where they should, that is upon the state and government. Is it possible that our state government under the rule of the reliable, infallible and perfect grand old republican party would suffer itself to be uched out of millions of acres of fine cultivable land by Hen. Owens? Still the fact remains on record to substantiate that such is the case. The settlers know or should know that they cannot successfully fight the title to the land known as Red-S the power may lay in the government but not in individuals. Why not appeal to Oregon's little "God Binger" who has succeeded, backed by large petitions, in establishing a few mail routes, and in getting the land questions into a muddle, but if through his efforts a settler has ever gotten an acre of land in dispute, we are not aware of it. "Bin-

ger" voted for the force bill and the McKinley tariff bill proving thereby his great love for the people, having to help him in his great work of reform and justice to settlers, the great Moguls of Oregon, Dolph and Mitchell, why the very roar of their balaam voices one would think sufficient to silence forever the voice of our cattle men who, however, scatter among us checks which are as good as cash and answer very well for a circulating medium that would be hard for us poor devils to dispense with, and when it comes to taxes the county vaults speak well for these same men. Don't drive such men from our midst but fight them in an honorable manner with credit to ourselves acknowledging their rights and worth to our community.
