SPOKANE'S FIRE.

Four Lives Lost and Several Men Are Missing.

SPOKANE FALLS, May 24—Another disastrous fire visited this city last evening. The flames were first noticed in the Spokane Mill Company's building on the river front, and so quickly did they spread that the employees were obliged to jump from the upper windows to save their lives. Three were badly injured in this way, and four are missing, and it is supposed that they have perished. The fire spread to the Echo roller mills, owned by Bravender & Keats; the oatmeal mill, owned by Alvey & Adams; the Washington shingle mills, the Spokane steam laundry, a number of residences and the Howard-street bridge. The damage all told will amount to \$300,000 with not much over \$50,000 insurance.

SEARCHING FOR THE BODIES.

The fire department played upon the smoldering ruins all night long. This morning the work of searching for the bodies of the victims began. It is now known that four men perished in the fire, and it is feared that others lost their lives. The missing men are: Adolph Schultze, L. B. Cornell, Richard Butcher and a man named Cunningham. The charred remains of the first three were taken out of the ruins of the Spokane Mill Company this morning. Search is being continued for the others. It is thought that one or two men were drowned in the river.

The fire was seen at long distances in the surrounding country. Flames of great volume leaped high in the air, and the river was rosy with the reflection. The fire originated from a hot journal in the Spokane Mill Company's property.

TOM THUMB AND WIFE.

ODEN, May 20—Mrs. General Tom Thumb and her husband, Count Magdi, have met with financial trouble in this city. Last Monday evening Mrs. Thumb's company including herself, Count and Baron Magdi and others, appeared at the opera house. Next morning an attachment was served on the Lilliputians for \$4500, being on account of a note that the count, his wife and manager Sackett of the Salt Lake Wanderland had signed over a year ago. A man named Kellog is made plaintiff in the suit. The matter was kept quiet until yesterday, when it was compromised. It is said the count and his wife have a suit now pending in Salt Lake for the recovery of a large sum of money from Sackett. Tomorrow the Lilliputians will continue their tour, going north to Montana.—East Oregonian.
