To Whom Does the Fleece Belong.

We answer to the republicans, and they deserve it because of their fidelity to the party and its principles. The democracy of this county can only blame itself for its defeat. Many republicans since the election have come to us with the exclamation. "Now where is your democratic party? You claim to have a hundred or probably one hundred and twenty-five majority in the county, they did not show up at this election." We certainly have been taught a lesson and one that we think will profit the party to the extent of convincing it that going off on side issues and new parties can only result in doing ourselves an injury. While we have some cause in this county to censure our party for conduct in this election still in the state the outlook for democracy is very encouraging, we failed to elect the two congressmen but we elected Chamberlain—democrat—to the office of Attorney General. We lost our Joint Representative but we elected our candidate for District Judge. The republican victory, in our county is shortlived and the confusion caused in the democratic ranks by the organization of the peoples party in our midst will no longer be felt and that breeze has blown over leaving in its track the evidence of its malice and political spite in which the democrats, who were foolish enough to affiliate, behold the mistake they have made in upholding political "sore heads" and countenancing, aiding and abetting by supporting a mixture of democracy, republicanism and peoples party demagoguery that has resulted in a victory to the republican party. The democratic party is here and here to stay the republican party have for years striven to kill it and have not succeeded and it will certainly never succumb to a peoples party arrangement without merit or reward and headed by all the political "sore-heads" in the nation.

Australian Ballot System.

The Australian ballot system meets with general approval, to judge from the comment of the press. There certainly cannot be any serious objection to this mode of voting. A voter has a booth all to himself and sufficient time allowed him to calmly and coolly select from the ticket the candidates he thinks worthy, while we hear of some few mistakes made and ballots voted that could not be counted on account of irregularities made by the voter in his selection, still its only an occasional and very occasional error. It is certainly a very independent way of voting and obstructs, very materially the work of bosses and rustlers in the employ of rings or candidates who take all advantages possible to accomplish their ends. A man will hesitate a long time before making up his mind to offer a voter a hundred or two dollars for his vote for fear the voter will pocket the money [which he ought to do] and go into the booth and vote to suit himself.

The following is the result of the Republican National Convention. Harrison was nominated on the

first ballot receiving 565, McKinley 183, Blaine 175, Reed 4, Lincoln 1. White-law Reid was unanimously nominated for Vice President.

### THE SILVER QUESTION.

The American people, from tradition and interest, favor bi-metalism, and republican party demands the use of both gold and silver as standard money, with such restrictions and under such provisions, to be determined by legislation as will secure the maintenance of a parity of the values of the two metals, so that the purchasing and debt-paying power of the dollar, whether silver, gold or paper, shall be at all times equal. The interests of the producers of the country, its farmers and workingmen, demand that every dollar, paper or coin, issued by the government, shall be as good as any other. We commend the wise and patriotic steps already taken by our government to secure an international conference to adopt such measures as will insure a parity of value between gold and silver for use as money throughout the world.

The above plank shows that the republicans on the silver question always come out at the same hole they go in at.

Dallas Times Mountaineer: The Australian voting system is generally received with favor; but with the privilege permitted of fixing up sample ballots py strikers, it is not a perfect remedy for the evils connected with the elective franchise in this country. If a voter can be "approached," he can have a "fixed" ballot placed in his hands which may be copied in the booths on the one furnished him by the judges. Of course, there is not the certainty of him obeying the behests of the bosses as under the old plan, and this being an advancement in the right direction we may hope for greater improvements in the future.
